## NIBRS

### Transition Update

There are quite a few updates this month for the National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS) transition: 1. The State Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program has received the Project Plan and is currently reviewing it. Once it has been approved the UCR Program will distribute it to agencies.

2. All current Wyoming statutes have been mapped to NIBRS codes. The Excel spreadsheet is attached to this email.

3. The State has purchased a Summary Reporting System (SRS) Module that will help streamline and automate current Summary data. It is anticipated to begin processing monthly submissions by early March. In order to prepare for this transition, the UCR

Program is requesting that all Summary data be submitted in an Excel workbook or a flat file/csv format and that Domestic Violence data be submitted in an Excel Spreadsheet. We will not have the ability to manually enter data directly into this module. By consolidating both

SRS and NIBRS data in the same repository, the UCR Program will be able to certify agencies with increased accuracy and provide a stable and accessible database for agencies.

## PLAY 5

### Identify Critical Sponsors and Gain Their Support

This is important in regards to acquiring funding for a NIBRS module (if that is the route you take). It is also imperative to identify your key stakeholders such as victim services organizations who may have grant funding available to

contribute to the project. If this is not an option for your agency, there is a free option available. Smaller contributing agencies will find the Incident Editor feature useful as a cost-effective alternative to investing in a full NIBRS-compliant

record management system (RMS). It is recommended that agencies that report 10 or less incidents a month use this option.

## SUMMARY TRAINING CORNER

### Unfounded Property Values

The topic for this week has been an issue with some agencies. This is just to bring awareness to this problem and to help agencies understand how to identify and correct it. It has been noticed, particularly with larcenies. When a larceny is

unfounded the dollar amount for stolen property in that particular incident, should not show up on the Supplement to Return A Property by Type and Value and the Monetary Value of Property Stolen column. When an unfounded property value is not

removed from the Supplement to Return A form there will be no number in the "Number of Actual Offenses" Column and there will be a monetary amount in the "Monetary Value of Property Stolen" Column.

Below is an example:

### Incorrect Example Unfounded Property Values

#### Example

In this example, two larcenies were reported on the Return A. One is deemed unfounded, and the other, an actual offense. On the Supplement to Return A,

there are two Offenses represented in the larceny sections when there should only be one. The purple cells on the far right show that only one

larceny actually occurred. There should only be one larceny showing property stolen and only one larceny offense showing.
